

Announcing the winners... Black and White Spider Awards 2006




Danielle Herzog from the USA impressed the judges with this quirky image


Photographers whose work demonstrated the highest degree of achievement in black and white were nominated by a 'who's who' panel of




Jeff Zaruba of the USA received the highest accolade this year, and becomes the Black and White Spider Awards Professional Photographer of the Year




This wintry composition was artistically snapped up by Mirana Comstock of the USA




